Where the study aims to integrate local wisdom in the English learning process to improve students' understanding of the material and build a sense of love for regional culture. In addition, this study uses the Research and Development (R&D) method with the ADDIE (Analysis, Design, Development, Implementation, Evaluation) development model. Where the initial stage of this study began by analyzing the needs of students and teachers through interviews and observations. The results of the analysis showed that students had difficulty understanding the material due to the lack of relevance between the material taught and the conditions in their daily lives. Therefore, the learning materials developed include materials such as folklore, traditional songs and local proverbs that are relevant to local culture. The resulting module will then be tested on grade VII students at a junior high school in South Sulawesi. The results of the evaluation showed that students were more enthusiastic about learning English because the material used was more contextual and interesting. In addition, there was a significant increase in students' understanding of vocabulary and grammar. Through this study, it was also concluded that local wisdom-based learning media can be an innovative alternative to improve the quality of English learning. This study is a very important reference in the development of similar modules, especially for secondary education levels with a strong cultural background [3].


